THE DEBATE AFTER THE DEBATES:

While families and small partisan groups throughout the country gather to watch the Presidential debates, many Escondido residents will do something different – Democrats and Republicans alike will gather to watch the debates and then watch high school and college students continue the discussion.

"From a standpoint of voter education – the Presidential debates are the most important events of the campaign. Voters are treated to an organized discussion of the important issues affecting our future" said Elizabeth Gabrych, President of the League of Women Voters for Escondido and Neighboring Communities. "Unfortunately, the post debate analysis too often focuses only the candidates – not the issues they have just debated. In a small way we are trying to change that." For nearly a century, the League of Women Voters has been the major grassroots organization which is devoted to the cause of voter education and service. Membership is open to all who are interested in improving democracy through better voter understanding of the issues.

After watching the debates on television in the Escondido City Council Chambers on September 26 and October 7, teams of students will continue to debate the issues.

On September 26, students from High Tech High School in San Marcos will focus on the foreign policy matters that the candidates have just discussed. "We are excited to partner with the League of Women Voters for this event", said Nicki Hinostro, Director of High School – North County. "Our mission at High Tech High School is to use modern technology to better educate students for the 21st Century. That includes a major emphasis on providing our students with a solid background in public policy matters. By participating in this event, we are not only achieving that goal but also hopefully providing an important public service to voters in Escondido."

On October 7, teams organized by the Democratic and Republican clubs at California State University San Marcos will continue to debate the subjects discussed by the candidates in the second Presidential debate. "The purpose of political clubs at a public university is not limited to campus activities", said Chasen Bullock, President of the San Marcos College Republicans. "We attempt to serve our surrounding communities with a variety of campaign activities. My Democratic counterparts and I look at this event as an opportunity to do just that."

The debates will be moderated by Patrick Coony, the Escondido League voter services director. Mr. Coony is an Administrative Law Judge and the author of a web site, Newsbatch.com, which focuses on voter education regarding national issues. The Presidential debates will begin at 6PM and finish at 7:30. The student debates will start at 7:45PM and end at 9PM. The student debates will be replayed on television in Escondido on Cox Channel 18 at various times prior to election day. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

"HERONS' HOUSE: A ZERO ENERGY HOME.

On a beautiful Saturday in August, board member Yolanda Fleet and I headed to Carlsbad in Celebration of County League Day. The event was a tour of Peder and Julie Norbys' "Herons' House", a Zero energy home in a residential area of Carlsbad east of I-5.

The house is a remodel of a standard 70's style 3,400 sq. ft. home that now looks more like a craftsman bungalow in Pasadena. It is a celebration of art, architecture, and energy efficiency, surrounded by a yard transformed into a vineyard and native plant garden.

The house takes advantage of ocean breezes and ocean views with 98 dual-glazed windows and no screens. It generates 80 to 100 percent of its own electricity with an attractive 7-kilowatt solar photovoltaic array on the roof. Pretty impressive when you consider they have two teenagers, lots of lights, big screen TVs, computers, jukebox, stereo, modern kitchen appliances, etc.

Herons' House also captures rainwater for the vineyard, and utilizes the newest style tankless water heater for efficiency. After touring the house, yard and wine cellar, we enjoyed box lunches and heard several excellent presentations of water conservation and the water crisis facing San Diego County. It was a very inspiring day
